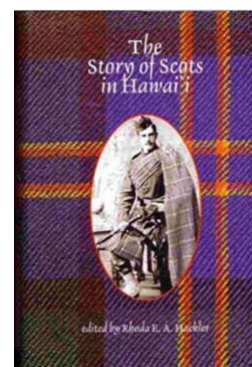
Items for Sale
